75th Day of Prayer

1) Our Hearts

Therefore, you should pray like this: Our Father in heaven, Your name be honored as holy. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. (Matthew 6:9-10)

2) Our Leaders...National, State, Local, Military

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions... (1 Timothy 2:1-2)

Lord,

- give our leaders wisdom, humility, justice, and restraint
- protect them from pride, corruption, fear of man, and foolish counsel
- help them uphold what is good, restrain evil, and serve the people entrusted to them
- bless Houston with peace, public safety, integrity, compassion, and justice
- help us live “peaceful and quiet” lives marked by godliness and dignity

3) Pastors and Churches, Deacons, Pathmakers

Pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ... (Colossians 4:3)

Lord,

- strengthen pastors to preach the Word faithfully and shepherd with courage
- protect churches from compromise, division, distraction, and spiritual weariness
- raise up godly men in our churches who love Christ, lead their homes, and serve others
- make our churches places of holiness, hospitality, discipleship, repentance, and joy
- open doors for the gospel across Houston through faithful churches

4) Those far from God

The Lord...is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. (2 Peter 3:9)

Lord,

- open blind eyes and soften hard hearts
- bring conviction of sin, hunger for truth, and hope in Christ
- save our family members, friends, neighbors, coworkers, and classmates
- use us as faithful witnesses who speak the truth with love
- bring many in Houston from darkness to light and from death to life

5) One Another

Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. (James 5:16)
