¹Therefore, my brothers and sisters, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, dear friends! 21 plead with Euodia and I plead with Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. 3 Yes, and I ask you, my true companion, help these women since they have contended at my side in the cause of the gospel, along with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life. 4 Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! 5 Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near.

Table Discussion

1. All we know about Euodia and Syntyche is that they were quarreling. It's unfortunate that these two women, who likely had prominent roles in the church as Philippi, are only known today for potentially their worst moment. What if my life – or at least the record of it in history – was summed up by one sentence. What would it be? What *could* it be?

- 2. Paul calls his "true companion" (v. 3) to help these women be reconciled. Where am I being called to be a force for reconciliation? Have I answered the call?
- 3. Where do I need to embrace joy and exhibit epieikeia?
