1 INTRODUCTION

SPOTLIGHT ON THE TITLE ROLES OF A MAN Roles of a Man is based on God's revealed truth of God's special design for men. This series addresses what God specifically expects and desires for us as men. Marriage is not a prerequisite to these biblical roles. If we are single men - old or young, we are held accountable to learn and fulfill these roles in the context of our current lives.

As we apply the roles in this series, we become a blessing and strength to our Bible study classes, our churches, our family, our workplace, our ministry and even society. Doing so is God's design. The lessons learned will also prepare us to be the husbands and fathers God calls us to be. Many times the context of the scripture passage may be in regard to the marriage relationship with a woman, yet the implication in most cases is general for all men and specific for marriage.

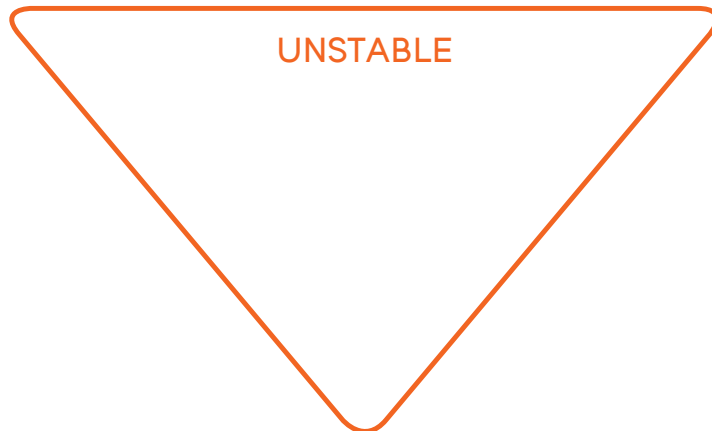
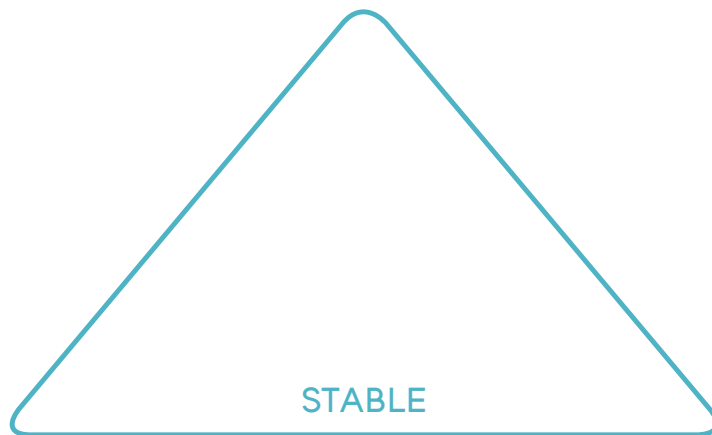

BIBLICAL DEFINITION OF MANHOOD

As we have met with men for over 50 years of combined ministry experience, we have seen a few areas which have made or broken manhood. One is the lack of clarity. According to Robert Lewis, in *Quest for Authentic Manhood*, the biblical definition of manhood is that men:

- Reject Passivity
- Accept Responsibility
- Lead Courageously
- Invest Eternally

Another area in need of clarity is the principle found in Genesis 2:24.

ONE ESSENTIAL PRINCIPLE

“For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and they will become one flesh.” *Genesis 2:24*

It is easy to possibly dismiss this as just another passage on marriage. In reality, it reveals the heart of a man who is living out the roles of a man. Marriage is just one context where we apply our roles as men. As we said earlier, however, manhood begins today. It is a choice we make.

Perhaps one of the more challenging hurdles for us as men (all ages and circumstances) is the principle we see in this passage of leaving our parents.

4 PROVIDER: THE DOCK MASTER



In America when we hear the word “provider,” especially in the context of a man’s role, we often think of _____provision.

But what does God’s Word have to say about being a provider? Let’s go back to Adam and see what God had in mind for him.

The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it. *Genesis 2:15*

That was before the Fall. Let’s fast forward to after the Fall and see what God had to say then.

To Adam he said, “Because you listened to your wife and ate from the tree about which I commanded you, ‘You must not eat of it,’ cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat of it all the days of your life. It will produce thorns and thistles for you and you will eat the plants of the field. By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return.” Adam named his wife Eve, because she would become the mother of all the living. *Genesis 3:17-20*

Once again, we return to Genesis and Adam. Early on in the story, God taught Adam not to eat the forbidden fruit.

And the LORD God commanded the man, “You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die.”

Genesis 2:16-17

We know that Eve is ultimately tricked by the serpent into eating the fruit and it was Adam whom God held responsible.

But the LORD God called to the man, “Where are you?” Genesis 3:9

The implication is if Adam is held responsible then God expected Adam to _____ Eve about the forbidden fruit. Adam knew about the dangers, but failed to inform Eve – and you know what happened as a result!

Let’s take another look at what God had to say about Abraham. He had a very specific role for Abraham within his family – to serve as their discipler.

VISION-CENTRIC ACCOUNTABILITY

Becoming effective spiritual teachers requires us, as men, to establish positive accountability in our lives. Growing in and applying God's Word and developing our ability to discern are tasks that require community. Every man needs a brother to come alongside you and encourage, challenge and point out when we may be going astray.

Below is a list of some of the components of an accountability group.

Refinement of Vision : God has called me to...

- Establish a Grow Group (small group)
- Closed groups, but not cliquish
- Select only men who are faithful, available, teachable (FAT)
- Set length of time and frequency to meet
- Establish format and rules
- Proactive, not reactive

“...and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you, to the very end of the age.”

Matthew 28:20

A captain needs a mission and a manifest.

Mission - make disciples.

Manifest - list of the cargo onboard - love God & love others.

Jesus replied: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.’ This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.”Matthew 22:37-40

A discipler, is the one who has the manifest of the supplies that are going on the boat.

Let’s go back to Genesis.

From the very beginning before the fall, God appointed the man to serve and lead in his kingdom.

The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it. Genesis 2:15



LIVING OUT THE JOURNEY

Post fall, today, we feel conflict and tension when we seek to lead women.

To the woman he said, "I will greatly increase your pains in childbearing; with pain you will give birth to children. Your desire will be for your husband, and he will rule over you." *Genesis 3:16*

Post fall, men struggle between the extremes of being autocratic and passive.

This is a lesson on whom God holds _____/_____ to lead in a relationship between a man and a woman after the Fall.

Another example from God's Word can be found in Joshua.

Now fear the LORD and serve him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your forefathers worshiped beyond the river and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD. *Joshua 24:14-15*

Our job is not to lord over others, but to lead them to God, as the Israelite leader, Joshua was God's instrument to lead/guide the Israelites. He is a servant leader or a guide in judging spiritual and practical matters.

CHRIST'S EXAMPLE Who better to look to for an example of a leader/guide than Jesus Christ? We see in Philippians that he took on this role with a _____ heart.

Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus, who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death-- even death on a cross. Philippians 2:5-8

Jesus Christ also serves as a model for us in terms of how to love our wives.

Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her . . . Ephesians 5:25

Christ's love toward the church was _____, and that's how we are called to love our wives. This is also even truer of Christian men and the bride of Christ. . .the church!

Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect as the weaker partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, so that nothing will hinder your prayers.

1 Peter 3:7

Our prayer lives will be impacted if we do not fulfill our responsibilities as prescribed by God.
