## Reminders on Parables:

- Often come in pairs or threes
- · Normally have one clear meaning
- Context matters

- Jesus' interpretation trumps all
- · Avoid allegorizing everything
- Culture matters; sometimes details do
- I. Read the two parables in Matthew 13:44-46
- <sup>44</sup> "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure, buried in a field, that a man found and reburied. Then in his joy he goes and sells everything he has and buys that field.

<sup>45</sup> "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls. <sup>46</sup> When he found one priceless pearl, he went and sold everything he had, and bought it.

- d. What, if anything, would you struggle to give up for the Gospel? Think about relationships, possessions, ambitions, etc.

- f. How would you modernize the parable to explain it to a friend?
