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First century Bible-writing missionary Paul uses the word "demons" in only three Bible verses (<u>1 Corinthians 10:20,21</u>; <u>1 Timothy 4:1</u>). The rest of the time, he uses language of geographical domain authority (examples: <u>Ephesians 1:20–21</u>; <u>2:2</u>; <u>3:10</u>; <u>Colossians 2:15</u>)

<u>Ephesians 6:12</u> - For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the <u>rulers</u>, against the <u>authorities</u>, against the <u>cosmic powers</u> over this present darkness, against the <u>spiritual forces of</u> <u>evil in the heavenly places</u>.

When the Babel-builders refused to image Yahweh and be what He made them to be (<u>Genesis 11:1-9</u>), He broke them into 70 nations (<u>Genesis 10</u>) and allotted them to the stewardship of the sons of God

<u>Deuteronomy 32:8–9</u> - When the Most High gave to the nations their inheritance, when he <u>divided</u> <u>mankind</u>, he fixed the borders of the peoples <u>according to the number of the sons of God</u>. ⁹ But the Lord's portion is his people, Jacob his <u>allotted</u> heritage.

<u>Deuteronomy 29:26</u> - And they went and served other gods and bowed down to them, gods whom they did not know them <u>and he had not allotted to them</u>. (See also <u>Deuteronomy 4:19–20</u> defined with <u>Deuteronomy 17:2–3</u>)

This doesn't mean that Yahweh abandoned those nations. He is loving and patient and chooses Israel (Abram's descendants) as the nations' way back to Him

<u>Genesis 12:1–3</u> - And Yahweh said to Abram, "Go out from your land and from your relatives, and from the house of your father, to the land that I will show you. ² And I will make you a great nation, and I will bless you, and I will make your name great. And you will be a blessing. ³ And I will bless those who bless you, and those who curse you I will curse. <u>And all families of the earth will be blessed in you</u>."

Where else does the Bible confirm the idea of Yahweh delegating legitimate authority of the nations over to other *elohim* ("gods")?

<u>Matthew 4:8–10</u> - Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory. ⁹ And he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to him, "Be gone, Satan! For it is written, " 'You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve.'"

<u>Daniel 10:20–21</u> -Then he said, "Do you know why I have come to you? But now I will return to fight against the <u>prince of Persia</u>; and when I go out, behold, the <u>prince of Greece</u> will come. ²¹ But I will tell you what is inscribed in the book of truth: there is none who contends by my side against these except <u>Michael, your prince</u>. (define with <u>Revelation 12:7</u>)

How did the supernatural sons of God do in stewarding God's human family back to Him?

<u>Psalm 82:1–8</u> - God has taken his place in the divine council; <u>in the midst of the gods he holds</u> <u>judgment</u>: ² "How long will you judge unjustly and show partiality to the wicked? Selah ³ Give justice to the weak and the fatherless; maintain the right of the afflicted and the destitute. ⁴ Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked." ⁵ They have neither knowledge nor understanding, they walk about in darkness; all the foundations of the earth are shaken. ⁶ I said, "<u>You are gods, sons of the Most High, all of you;</u> ⁷ nevertheless, like men you shall <u>die, and fall like any prince</u>." ⁸ Arise, O God, judge the earth; for you shall inherit all the nations!

What is the future destiny of all treasonous *elohim* ("gods") and the humans who follow them?

<u>Matthew 25:41</u> - "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels."

REFLECTION POINT: "Who am I to judge another person's religion or beliefs?" NO ONE! That is not your role. Rejecting Yahweh and the One He sent (Jesus) and giving allegiance to false gods has already been judged.

<u>John 3:16–18</u> - "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes (pisteo = gives pistis) in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes (pisteo) in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe (pisteo) is <u>condemned already</u>, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God."

The authority over the nations is stripped from the unfaithful spiritual beings (*elohim*) and given to Jesus the Christ at His death, burial, resurrection, and enthronement

<u>John 12:31–32</u> – "Now is the judgment of this world; <u>now will the ruler of this world be cast out</u>. ³² And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself."

<u>Ephesians 1:19–21</u> - and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might ²⁰ that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹ far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.

Who are the children of God now?

- Adam was God's son (*Luke 3:38*) and was unfaithful (*Genesis 3:6*).
- Supernatural members of God's divine council were the sons of God and some were unfaithful (*Psalm 82*).
- Israel was God's son (*Exodus 4:22*; *Hosea 11:1*) and was unfaithful (*Deuteronomy* 32:15-19).
- Jesus the Christ came as the ultimate true Son of God (*Matthew 3:17*; <u>15:5</u>) and was finally perfectly faithful (*Philippians 2:5-7*).
- What about you and me?

<u>John 1:12–13</u> - But to all who did <u>receive him</u>, who <u>believed in his name</u>, he gave the right to <u>become children of God</u>, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

Just like the other children of God throughout the Bible, we have an assignment and a mission to grow the family of God

<u>Matthew 28:18–20</u> -And Jesus came and said to them, "<u>All authority in heaven and on earth</u> has been given to me. ¹⁹ Go therefore and make disciples of all <u>nations</u>, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

REFLECTION POINT: How is my life measuring up to the command to make disciples and bring others into God's family?
