

<u>Job 14:1</u> - Man who is born of a woman is few of days and full of trouble.

<u>Ecclesiastes 2:22–23</u> - What has a man from all the toil and striving of heart with which he toils beneath the sun? 23 For all his days are full of sorrow, and his work is a vexation. Even in the night his heart does not rest. This also is vanity.

<u>Psalm 144:4</u> - Man is like a breath; his days are like a passing shadow.

<u>1 Corinthians 15:1–10</u> - Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, ² and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. ³ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. ⁹ For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. ¹⁰ But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me.		
Contrary to the ridiculous caricatures of Heaven as inescapable misery as		
bodiless harp-playing cloud-dwellers, God has shown us that those who give allegiance to King Jesus Christ are promised a resurrected		
body in a restored world		

<u>1 Corinthians 15:42–49</u> - So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. ⁴³ It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. ⁴⁴ It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. ⁴⁵ Thus it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. ⁴⁶ But it is not the spiritual that is first but the natural, and then the spiritual. ⁴⁷ The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. ⁴⁸ As was the man of dust, so also are those who are of the dust, and as is the man of heaven, so also are those who are of heaven. ⁴⁹ Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the man of heaven.

<u>Luke 24:36–43</u> - As they were talking about these things, Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, "Peace to you!" 37 But they were startled and frightened and

thought they saw a spirit. ³⁸ And he said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹ See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. <u>Touch me</u>, and see. For a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ And while they still <u>disbelieved for joy</u> and were marveling, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate before them.

<u>John 20:26–28</u> - Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "<u>Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side</u>. Do not disbelieve, but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"

<u>Philippians 3:20–21</u> - But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹ who <u>will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body</u>, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself.

<u>Job 19:25–27</u> - For I know that my Redeemer lives, and at the last he will stand upon the earth. ²⁶ And after my skin has been thus destroyed, <u>yet in my flesh I shall see God</u>, ²⁷ whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold, and not another. My heart faints within me!
