God desires for His prophetic community to be _____. He wants us to thrive mentally, emotionally, spiritually, and in every way. Revelation was designed to elevate us into the abundance of the way God operates. Creating the environment of heaven is imperative for God's prophetic community. An unhealthy prophetic community will often carry a lack of _____, and therefore, struggle with insecurity, selfish ambition, narcissism, and even betrayal. For example: If the prophetic gift grows in a selfish or narcissistic environment, then our prophetic words mostly revolve around us and our greatness. The desire to be great is amazing and very biblical. The _____, however, requires a community of people who are healthy enough to see you "future present" and elevate their relationship with you to a place of investment into your process.

What does an Emotionally Healthy Church have to do with LIVING A THIRD HEAVEN REALITY?

To have a "Third Heaven" reality means that we have been _____ by the culture of Heaven. What is the culture of Heaven? Heaven's culture begins with honor. Honor is the byproduct of LOVE. Our ability to honor God and each other in seasons of ease or difficulty is directly related to being emotionally healthy.

One day, God began to speak to me about the necessity of the Church to become emotionally healthy. He started talking to me about the importance of EQ. I had heard of IQ, which is our intellectual quotient, but I hadn't heard of EQ, and since then I have also learned about the importance of developing our SQ (spiritual quotient) as well.

The more I began to learn about the necessity of being emotionally healthy for every Christian, the more I could honestly say that a lot of what I have helped Christian's with, for the last 25 years, has been mostly about being emotionally healthy.

Learning how to be emotionally healthy _____ you and those around you, your family, your job, your relationships, your finances, and it aids you in the things you prioritize. An emotionally unhealthy person will prioritize their life way differently than a healthy person.

Emotionally unhealthy people often _____ from a disempowered state, marked by fear and narcissism. An emotionally healthy person manifests peace and a healthy concept of how to live a life of contribution and honor. They process their past as a catalyst to a powerful future and learn to thrive. Because of developing this culture and mindset, God can put them in places of influence and resources. Healthy people carry the trait of generosity that exists in heaven. Healthy people have a connection to heaven's values and character that they live by. Healthy people are always looking to honor instead of looking to be honored.

Bill Johnson, in his book called "The Way of Life" describes four pillars for a healthy culture:

1. GOD IS GOOD - **therefore** DREAM BIG!
2. NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE - **therefore** TAKE RISKS.
3. JESUS BLOOD PAID FOR EVERYTHING - **therefore** I OWE HIM MY COMPLETE TRUST.
4. WE ARE SIGNIFICANT - **therefore** SERVE WELL.

Being emotionally healthy means that you are _____ to operate from a place of strength and contribution no matter the situation. It manifests in our _____ lives, in how we show up in conversations, and in our thought life. We were made to operate from a place of empowerment vs being or feeling disempowered. Being emotionally healthy helps you to _____ healthy expectations of your role in relationships and it helps us to have healthy expectations of those who are in relationship with us.

Jesus said "If you've _____ me, you've seen my Father". There is something so powerful about the invitation to partner with the Holy Spirit so people around you will actually see the Father through your life.

Jesus didn't _____ His way into the life of anyone, but He lived boldly and unapologetically before people and that made them divinely jealous to want what He had and be willing to find out how to get it. He was bold, but He was humble. He was the LION and He was the LAMB.

The church should be able to easily spot false prophets, because they are usually _____ people to themselves, questioning leadership to build themselves up, capturing hearts through being intriguing (see Daniel 11), and can't tell you the vision of the house because they've been too busy building their own. We want the church to identify these wounded people and not get caught in their deception.

Many people will prophecy something that may be _____ your scope, authority, or thought process. be sure not to call someone a "false prophet" because you are _____ to see what they see. Notice, the above scripture does not say that people should prophecy according to YOUR faith.

Prophecy, at its core, is articulating the thoughts of God. All of these tools help us to quickly adjust our thoughts and mindsets to match His. Operating in the Third Heaven requires us to know the difference between our opinion and God's thoughts.
