It was during this season we started calling ourselves a Tribe, (disclaimer: long before it was *trending* thanks to Seth Godin's best seller "Tribes.") We identify as family, committed to developing a culture of honor where everyone is seen as the royalty that they are..

- **When** you come into our environment we want you to experience honor and a culture that is set apart from typical clicks.
- **Community** goes beyond our immediate Tribe, we are committed to building relationships with other area churches through serving the visions of others to impact the region as a whole.
- **We** serve our community each year through unique and targeted initiatives that meet pressing needs in our area. (Leader to share on current initiatives in play)
- **Yes**, community does include friendship, however the DNA of our community is about service and and growing relationships with other churches and area influencers.
- **The** best way to form a healthy community is to create a Tribe that leads people to Jesus. A community prays together, makes decrees, proclamations and will prophesy over our Tribe/Region.
- **Community** development occurs when you realize what you add! We are not a "give me" community, but one grounded in service and generosity of our own giving. We are not here for what we can get, but for what we can give.
