## Adult Sunday School – The Gospel of Mark Small Group Questions for February March 20, 2022

1. In Mark 14: 3-9 we have the story of Jesus being anointed in Bethany.

## Mark 14:3-9 (ESV)

- <sup>3</sup> And while he was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, as he was reclining at table, a woman came with an alabaster flask of ointment of pure nard, very costly, and she broke the flask and poured it over his head.
- <sup>4</sup> There were some who said to themselves indignantly, "Why was the ointment wasted like that?
- <sup>5</sup> For this ointment could have been sold for more than three hundred denarii and given to the poor." And they scolded her.
- <sup>6</sup> But Jesus said, "Leave her alone. Why do you trouble her? She has done a beautiful thing to me.
- <sup>7</sup> For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you want, you can do good for them. But you will not always have me.
- <sup>8</sup> She has done what she could; she has anointed my body beforehand for burial.
- <sup>9</sup> And truly, I say to you, wherever the gospel is proclaimed in the whole world, what she has done will be told in memory of her."
- 2. What do you make of this? Are you disturbed, as the on looker was, by the waste of the expensive ointment? Do you think it is appropriate or not? Why?
- 3. What do you make of the statement "For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you want, you can do good for them"?
- 4. Does this trouble you? What does "always" here imply? Can nothing be done? Does this inspire you to do more or make you feel helpless to do anything?
- 5. What do you think your reaction would be if you were there at this dinner? How would you have engaged Jesus? Would you have asked questions? Run away? Anointed Him?
