Paul grounds the teachings in this passage on ultimate **truths**. He is exposing the way God has ordered the world.

Examples:

- Vs. 3 We are capable of being deceived in our own fallen minds and hearts.
- Vs. 7 Again, we are able to be deceived; God will not be mocked.
- Vs. 8 This verse says that God made the world to work on a principle of you get what you give. This principle applies to all of life and it intrinsic to the nature of reality.
