The Gospel of John elaborates on the political situation. Matthew, Mark, and Luke elaborate on the disciples' growth in ministry.

A miracle and its meaning

This passage has a natural explanation, and a supernatural explanation. Which is it?

- 2 Kgs. 4:42-44 (Enough barley loaves for 20 men, multiplied by God's word to feed 100.)
- John 6:13-14 So they gathered them up and filled twelve baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves left by those who had eaten. ¹⁴ When the people saw the sign that he had done, they said, "This is indeed the Prophet who is to come into the world!"

The Compassion of Jesus

Sheep without a shepherd

Mark 6:34 He had compassion on them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd.

What it means to be a sheep

- Num. 27:16-17 Let the LORD, the God of the spirits of all flesh, appoint a man over the congregation ¹⁷ who shall go out before them and come in before them, who shall lead them out and bring them in, that the congregation of the LORD may not be as sheep that have no shepherd."
- Isaiah 53:6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all."

The world's spiritual condition

Untaught – they need Jesus' teaching Unhealthy – they need Jesus' healing Undefended – they need Jesus' deliverance from demons and the power of darkness Unled – they need Jesus' kingship Unfed – they need Jesus' food

The Mission of Jesus

Five elements of Jesus' mission

Welcome – "When the crowds learned it, they followed him, and he welcomed them." Teaching – "and spoke to them" Kingship – "of the kingdom of God" Healing – "and cured those who needed healing." Bread – "I am the bread of life, whoever comes to me will never go hungry."

It's not about the bread!

What's deeply ironic about this story is that the multiplication of bread isn't really the main thing. We know God can make bread. He made the whole universe. This story is about something else!

The book of John elaborates on this deep misunderstanding. John 6:34-35 "They said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life..." John 6:41 "So the Jews grumbled about him because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven."

The Power of Jesus

Overcoming wrong instincts

Note the contrast – Jesus welcomes them, the disciples want to send them away. The disciples focus on their own ability to feed the crowd. Instead, they need to look to Jesus.

Looking to Jesus

He broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd.
