A warning to those of us with theological accuracy.

#### Which is easier?

On the one hand, it's easier to "say" your sins are forgiven than "do" the impossible miracle. After all, declaring a person's sins to be forgiven is an invisible action that nobody can prove or disprove. In this case, the powerful and undisputable healing shows that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins. If he can do what is more difficult, than certainly he can do what is easier.

On the other hand, which is it truly easier for Jesus to do? Healing the man of his paralysis only took a
short phrase and a moment of concentration. Forgiving the man's sin would take a little bit more than
