### Why Run?

Chap. 4:2-3 "And he prayed to the LORD and said, 'O LORD, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster. <sup>3</sup> Therefore now, O LORD, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live.'"

## **Resembling Jonah**

Proud Judgmental Hateful Self-righteous Running from God Asleep

## Sailors

#### These sailors are model citizens

*Vs.* 6 – The captain said, "What do you mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your god! Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish."

Vss. 12-13 – They refuse to throw him overboard until all other options are exhausted

#### Ignorance and Conversion

Vss. 9-10 "I am a Hebrew, and I fear the Lord, the God of heaven, who made the sea and dry land. Then the men were exceedingly afraid..."

## Verses 9 and 10 are the climax of the passage

- A Sailors are afraid; the sea rages (4)
- B Sailors cry to their gods (5a)
- C Attempts to save the ship (5b)
  - D Jonah is asked to help (6-7)
  - E Sailors ask Jonah the cause of the storm (8)

# F PROCLAMATION BY JONAH (9-10)

- E` Sailors ask Jonah the remedy to the storm (11)
- D` Jonah gives instructions that will help (12)
- C` Attempts to save the ship are in vain (13)
- B` Sailors cry to the LORD (14)
- A` Sailors are afraid of the LORD, sea quits raging (15-16)

## God

# Who is God trying to save?

Especially look at *B* and *B*`, vss. 5,14 "Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried out to his god..." "Then they called out to the Lord..." and "They offered sacrifice and made vows."

# How does he do it?

## Looking forward to Jesus – Mark 4:37

- Both stories have a storm on a sea, causing the boat to fall apart
- Both stories have the main character, asleep in the lower part of the boat
- Both stories have the men afraid because of the storm, but then more afraid because of God
- Both stories have the sailors cry out "Don't you care that we are perishing?"
- But in Jonah, Jonah's life is forfeit to save the sailors. In Jesus's story...
