Isaiah 46:6-7 "Those who lavish gold from the purse, and weigh out silver in the scales, hire a goldsmith, and he makes it into a god; then they fall down and worship! They lift it to their shoulders, they carry it, they set it in its place, and it stands there; it cannot move from its place. If one cries to it, it does not answer or save him from his trouble.

Ex. 33:11 Thus the Lord spoke to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend.

God as father

Mark 14:36 Abba, father, all things are possible for you.

Romans 8:15 For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, "Abba! Father!"

How the World Can Know How to Pray

The Captain's rebuke

Put another way: "We all know there is a God out there, and our attempts at reaching him have failed because we don't know who he is. But maybe you have a God that is real, Jonah. Stop sleeping and call out to him!"
