<u>1:1-3</u> The order for the census

- 1) The Lord initiated from the Tabernacle of meeting.
- 1:12) The time is about 11 months or
so after arriving at Sinai. Ex.19:1
- **<u>1:2-3</u>** God commands a census to be taken of all the congregation by Moses and Aaron.

1) The census is limted to males.

2) The age requirement was from 20 upwards.

3) The person able to go to war.

<u>1:17-46</u> The representatives for the census.

- **1:17-18** The heads recited their ancestry according to their families, fathers' house and age requirement. * TheNew Testament says not many noble not many mighty are called...<u>1Cor. 1:26-27, Jn. 3:3-5, Ja. 1:23</u>
- **<u>1:19-46</u>** The individual census of each tribe.
- **<u>1:19-21</u>** Ruben had 46, 500
- <u>1"22-23</u> Simeon had 59,300
- **<u>1:24-25</u>** Gad had 45, 650

 - **<u>1:47-49</u>** God commanded it.
 - 1:50-54 The Levites duties1) The Tabernacle, furnishings and the camp. vs. 50

- 2) The setting up an dtaking down of the Tabernacle. vs. 51
 3) The Levites were to be the buffer between the congregaton and the Lord being immediately aroud the Tabernacle and Israel outside of them, lest wrath come upon them. vs.52-53

 - **<u>2:1-2</u>** They each were to camp by their own standard, besides the emblem of their father's house.
 - **<u>2:3-9</u>** Judah camped on the east of the Tabernacle with Issachar and Zebulun with 186,400, breaking camp first.
 - **2:10-16** Ruben camped on the south side of the Tabernacle with Simeon and Gadwith 151,450, breaking camp second.

- **<u>2:17</u>** Then the Levites brode camp.
- **<u>2:18-24</u>** Ephraim camped on the west side of the Tabernacle with Manasseh and Benjamin with 108,100, braking camp third.
- **2:25-31** Dan camped on the north side of the Tabernacle with Asher and Naphtali with 157,600, braking camp last.

- <u>3:5-13</u> <u>The Levites are taken by the Lord as His</u> <u>own</u> and a gift to Aaron for service.

- **<u>3:5-10</u>** To serve Aaron, the congregation, Tabernacle and the camp.
- <u>3:11-13</u> The Lord exchanges the first born for the Levites. <u>Ex. 11:4, 13:15,</u> <u>22:29, 34:19</u>

3:14-39 The census of the Levites

- 3:14-20 1) The census was from one month an dablye.
 2) The families of the Levites were Gershon, Kohath and Merari
- <u>3:21-26</u> Gershon's censu, encampment, leader and duties.
- <u>3:27-31</u> Kohath's census, encampment, leader and duties.
- <u>3:32-37</u> Merari's census, encampment, leader and duties.
- **<u>3:38</u>** Moses and Aaron encamped on the east side in front of the gate to the court yard.

- **<u>3:39</u>** The sum tatal of the Levites was 22,000, from one month and above.
- 3:40-51 The Lord redeems the Levite by paying five shekels per person of the first born who were greater than the Levite, 273 of them, a sum of 1,365 shekels.
 - <u>3:40-43</u> The censu of the first born from one month and above.
 - <u>**3:44-51**</u> The transaction executed.
- <u>4:1-3</u>3 <u>The census and duties of the three</u> <u>families of the Levites of when braking</u> <u>camp.</u>
 - **<u>4:1-3</u>** The age of service was thirty to fifty.
 - * Twenty-five to thirty was apprenticship. $\underline{8:24}$
 - **<u>4:4-20</u>** The duties of the Koathites.
 - **<u>4:4</u>** Their duty related to the most Holy things in the Tabernacle.

- 4:5-15 The sons of Aaron first went in to cover the holy things so that the Koathites not die.
 * The various coverings represented the color of heaven, royalty mixed with humanity, the badger skin.
