## **Unstoppable Week 6: Hints Of The Future**

*Acts 1:1-3, Acts 1:8, Acts 28:16-20, Acts 26:6-8, Acts 17:1-3*

*Acts 28:21-24, Acts 28:25-28, Romans 11:12, Acts 28:30-31, Acts 15:8-9*

Have you ever experienced unexpected kindness from a stranger? What happened, and how did it impact you?

### **Read Acts 28:11-22**

Acts 23:11 comes true. What does Paul's journey to Rome tell us about God's faithfulness to His promises?

Why do you think Luke includes the detail that Paul was allowed to live by himself with a guard?

Why does Paul first reach out to the Jewish leaders in Rome? What does this show about his priorities?

Is it surprising that these Jewish leaders didn't know who Paul was, considering all of his previous missionary journeys? What's significant about it?

### **Read Acts 28:23-31**

What stood out to you about Paul's efforts to explain and convince them about Jesus from the Law of Moses and the Prophets?

What is significant about Paul spending two years boldly preaching the kingdom of God and teaching about Jesus "without hindrance"?

Being the last words of Luke in the book, how does that link the whole book together?

What does this chapter teach us about God's ability to use every situation - even imprisonment - for His purposes?

How would you summarize the theme of Paul's life and ministry based on the entire book of Acts?
