Questions

1. How do you think Abraham felt when God first called him to leave everything familiar and go to an unknown land? Can you relate to a time when God asked you to step out in faith?
2. Abraham repeatedly struggled with trusting God's protection and provision. What are some areas in your life where you find it difficult to trust God completely?
3. The sermon mentioned that a half-truth is still a lie. Why do you think we sometimes justify telling partial truths, and how can we commit to greater honesty?
4. What does it mean to you that God is genuine - that He is exactly who He says He is? How does this impact your relationship with Him?

5. Abraham and Sarah laughed at God's promise of a child in old age, yet God remained faithful. How has God shown His faithfulness to you even when you've doubted?
6. The story of Abraham and Isaac is challenging. What do you think this story teaches us about God's character and Abraham's faith?
7. How can we demonstrate God's integrity (being genuine, truthful, and faithful) in our everyday relationships and interactions?
8. The sermon mentioned several examples of faithfulness - long marriages, job commitment, church attendance. What are some ways you can show greater faithfulness in your current commitments?

Life Application

This week, identify one area where you can better reflect God's integrity. Choose to be more genuine in a relationship, more honest in a situation where you might be tempted to stretch the truth, or more faithful in a commitment you've made. Take one specific action that demonstrates God's character of integrity through your life, and consider sharing your experience with someone who can encourage you in this growth.

2. God is veracious - He is completely honest and truthful, never lies, and calls us to live with the same honesty and integrity
