Questions

- What was the difference between how the Israelites responded to being thirsty versus how Joshua responded to Moses' call to battle? What can we learn from this contrast?
- Why do you think Moses chose Joshua specifically to lead the battle against the Amalekites, especially after the people had been grumbling against Moses?
- What is the significance of Moses' hands being held up during the battle? How
 does this relate to the role of spiritual leadership and support in the church today?

- The sermon mentions that we live in a world with two kingdoms God's kingdom and Satan's kingdom. How do you see evidence of this spiritual battle in your daily life?
- How can we avoid the negative example of 'Massah and Meribah' (testing and quarreling) when we face difficulties or challenges in our faith journey?
- What does it mean practically to 'rally around Jesus Christ as our banner' in today's world? How can we do this as individuals and as a church?
- The sermon emphasizes supporting spiritual leaders in the church. What are some practical ways we can encourage and support our pastors and church leaders?
- How does understanding eternal rewards motivate you to live faithfully for Christ, even when facing opposition or difficulties?

Life Application

This week, identify one area where you've been tempted to grumble or complain instead of trusting God's provision and plan. Choose to 'rally around Jesus as your banner' by praying specifically about this situation and looking for ways to support rather than criticize the spiritual leadership in your life. Additionally, reach out to encourage a spiritual leader in your church through a note, prayer, or practical support.
