Connect: How do you view death? Have you had a good experience or negative experience? Say more about that.

Engage: Reread Psalm 90

What stands out to you? Is there a verse that is particularly encouraging to you as you read it?

Zach talked about 3 movements with Psalm 90

1. Our problem with Death
2. Our Search for Meaning
3. Our Unexpected Hope.

1. Our problem with Death

- a. God is eternal, we are not.
- b. Where are you in your age? Do you ever think about your life and what you would want your life to look like as you grow older? Do you take time not in a morbid sense but a pondering

Zach talked about 3 titles that Walter Bruggerman shared.

- a. Orientation, 2. Disorientation, 3. Reorientation.
- b. Have you experienced these in your life?

2. Our search for Meaning

- a. When something feels unlimited, we waste it. – What do you think of this statement? Have you felt like you have wasted some life?

- b. Where do you see people searching for meaning? How does that play out in 2026?

- c. Where do you need to ask the Lord to establish the work of your hands?

- 3 Our unexpected Hope.

- a. Because of Christ – we have hope. Jesus gets it. How does that make you feel? Do you believe it? How does that change your life? Do you have hope of eternal life through Jesus?

Apply: Psalm 90 does not tell us to pretend those limits are not real but to take our unfinished lives and put them into the hands of the eternal God. How is that going to change you even this week? What is the invitation for you this week? Where do you need to put your life into the eternal God?
