**4. Think about a storm or difficult season you've experienced.**

- How did that season reveal what your life was built upon?
- What helped you remain steady—or what did God teach you through it?

**5. The sermon emphasized that storms are not the exception; they're the expectation.**

- How does that truth change the way we think about suffering and hardship?
- How can the church better support one another during life's storms?

**6. Foundations are built one small moment at a time.**

- What are some simple, practical ways we can grow spiritually in everyday life?
- Which small habit has helped strengthen your faith the most?

**7. For those who have influence over children, students, or younger believers:**

- What are some ways you can intentionally help the next generation build their lives on Jesus?
- What opportunities has God already placed in front of you?
