THE HOLY GOSPEL

Luke 20:27-38

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke

All: **Glory to you O Lord**

Some Sadducees, who do not believe in the resurrection of the dead, try to trap Jesus. They formulate the convoluted case of a serial widow who marries a succession of seven brothers. Jesus responds by teaching about God to whom all are alive and in whom all relationships are fulfilled.

²⁷Some Sadducees, those who say there is no resurrection, came to [Jesus] ²⁸and asked him a question, “Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man’s brother dies, leaving a wife but no children, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother.

²⁹Now there were seven brothers; the first married, and died childless; ³⁰then the second ³¹and the third married her, and so in the same way all seven died childless. ³²Finally the woman also died. ³³In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had married her.”

³⁴Jesus said to them, “Those who belong to this age marry and are given in marriage; ³⁵but those who are considered worthy of a place in that age and in the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. ³⁶Indeed they cannot die anymore, because they are like angels and are children of God, being children of the resurrection. ³⁷And the fact that the dead are raised Moses himself showed, in the story about the bush, where he speaks of the Lord as the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. ³⁸Now he is God not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all of them are alive.”

As we partake of Holy Communion, we come knowing that the risen Jesus is always with us. For Immanuel means, "God is with us." "And I will be with you to the end of the age." We can count on encountering Jesus when we gather at the table. 



INTRO TO 2022 STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

THE LORD'S SUPPER AND GIVING

This year's stewardship focus is about holy communion, discipleship and giving. It is about Jesus being present in the congregation when we partake of the bread and the cup. We take communion as a community, a congregation, not just as individuals. We encounter Jesus as we gather at the table, he is with us. Therefore, for the next four Sundays we will gather at the rail (as you are able) to partake of communion. As a community we are people in covenant with one another and committed to a common life and purpose.

The Last Supper story assures us of Jesus' continuing presence especially as we follow Him in discipleship. **GIVING IN FAITH IS AT THE HEART OF THE IDENTITY AND ACTION OF A CONGREGATION OF DISCIPLES.** The story of the Lord's Supper inspires us to persevere in faithful discipleship.

The focus of biblical stewardship is not on the congregation's needs at all, but rather on the fact that generous giving is one of the basic acts of discipleship. This biblical stewardship is to help God's people grow in relationship with Jesus through the use of the time, talents and finances God has entrusted to us. Jesus died on the cross so that we could be disciples and make disciples.

Each time we partake of the Lord's Supper, we should ask the question, "How is God calling me to respond to His presence in my life today?" How we use our time, talents, and finances is not separate from the spiritual life of our congregation. It is infused in us each time we eat of the bread and drink of the cup.

Our stewardship focus this year is on our community as we gather to take Holy Communion – as we remember that we do this together in remembrance of our Lord, not just as individual believers. That there is bread and wine, discipleship and giving.
