2. How can we understand God from what has been made?
3. What is ultimate result of ignoring what God has revealed?
4. If there is design, then there must be a designer. How do you react to this statement?
5. Where can you see evidence of design in the created world?

Read Acts 17:16-33

6. According to verse 16, what was Paul's reaction to Athens?
7. Did Paul isolate himself from the prevailing culture of the city of Athens? What did it stir him to do?
8. How did Paul choose to engage with the culture of Athens? What is the significance of this?
9. Looking at verses 22-23, what did Paul find to relate the hope of the Gospel?

10. Paul engaged people around him and met them where they were, using elements of their culture to express biblical truth. What are ways that we can engage our culture and express biblical truth?
