



2. In verse 1, David refers to God's "unfailing love." The word used here also carries the context of "covenant loyalty". David is appealing to the relational promises of God. What relational promises has God given us? (Some verses to consider: John 3:16; Romans 10:9-10; 2 Corinthians 5:17; 2 Timothy 2:11-13)

3. Looking at verses 3-6, how would you characterize David's view of his sin? How can we see our sin in a similar manner?

4. What is the importance of confession in our restoration from sin?

5. Look at 1 John 1:8-2:2. What do these verses say about the nature of sin in our lives? What do they say about the importance of confession? Who do these verses say is on our side? What comfort does that provide?

6. Focusing on verses 7-11, how does David describe cleansing from sin?

7. What does a spiritual cleansing look like in our lives?

8. Focusing on verses 12-17, how do you describe David's plea for restoration?

9. What does restoration from our sin look like for us? Do you think it means we are free from all consequences of our sin?

10. Look at verse 13. What does David intend to do once he is restored?
