There they are inspected, cleaned, the prescriptions read and then packaged for use on eyeglass missions. Lions Clubs pay for processing them at the Wisconsin Lions Camp before they are donated to needy recipients in developing countries. Used hearing aids are collected, recycled, and donated to individuals who are unable to afford to buy them.
