

The Power of Community- Discussion Questions

The sermon emphasizes that faith was never meant to grow alone. In what ways have you experienced accelerated spiritual growth through community, and where might isolation be hindering your walk with God?

God declared in Genesis 2:18 that it was not good for Adam to be alone, even in a perfect paradise with direct access to God. What does this teach us about the essential nature of human community in God's design?

The redwood tree illustration shows that shallow roots can support massive growth when intertwined with other trees. How does this challenge our cultural emphasis on independence and self-reliance in the Christian life?

Hebrews 10:24-25 commands us not to neglect meeting together. How would you honestly evaluate whether you are merely attending church or truly participating in biblical community?

The sermon distinguishes between healthy solitude and dangerous isolation. How can you discern when your desire for alone time crosses into spiritually harmful isolation?

James 5:16 instructs us to confess our sins to each other so that we may be healed. What fears or past experiences might be preventing you from experiencing this kind of vulnerable, grace-filled community?

The pastor shared how accountability through Ever Accountable helped break a decades-long addiction. What areas of your life might benefit from this level of transparency and accountability with trusted believers?

The sermon states that healing happens when honesty meets grace. How can the church create environments where people feel safe to be honest about their struggles without fear of judgment or rejection?

Statistics showed that 90 percent of successful rehabilitation came from those connected to church and accountability groups before graduation. What does this reveal about the power of community in sustaining life transformation?

The story of the elderly woman on a walker investing in a former inmate demonstrates sacrificial community. Who in your life might God be calling you to invest in, even if it requires significant time and commitment?
