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INTRODUCTION

Many devotionals you might be familiar with begin with a suggested text to read from the Bible and then a page of reflection from the author. I have at least 3 of these kinds of Advent books on my shelf and love them. But this is different from that kind of study. The format of this workbook is based on the ancient tradition of fixed-hours of prayer. It is, at its heart, an invitation to a rhythm of prayer and scripture reading.

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This rhythm of life is practiced by many, including biblical characters like Daniel and Peter, and is mentioned in the Psalms (Daniel 6:10; Acts 10:9; Psalm 119:164). Throughout the history of Christianity people have engaged in this practice in a wide variety of ways. While it is in no way a command of scripture, people of faith have often shaped the rhythm of their lives around fixed times to pause, pray, and read scripture.

This study has multiple components, and I invite you to try as many of them out as you can and then to pick what works for you. There are lots of options, but you do not need to engage with all of them. If you are reading this, you already have a copy of the workbook. A RHYTHM OF LIFE

I would guess that the daily rhythm of my life is not exactly the same as yours, so while I am convinced that the daily habits of life with God are essential, the specific practices can be ones that are right for you in your season of life. There have been times in my own spiritual journey when a practice that was life-giving at one time became impossible or unhelpful at another. For example, I personally love lots of quiet time to read, but when I had small children, finding quiet time to read became incredibly challenging. Listening to the Bible on audio and traditional prayers of the church became a gift for me in a time of upheaval. When I could not pick what to read, the church read to me. When I was too tired to know how to pray, the church prayed for me.

This tradition has often been practiced by clergy - pastors, nuns, monks - all people whose job it is to read, teach, pray, and lead the church. But it does not belong to the professionals. Jesus has always been in the habit of meeting ordinary people in the midst of their ordinary lives and calling them to follow him. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, who took a walk and shared a meal with the risen Jesus, may you experience the transformative power of God in

This study is centered around the 4 traditional themes of advent: hope, peace, joy, and love. The main section of each week is focused on reading scripture. The reading for each day includes a Psalm and a section from the Old Testament and New Testament. I have tried to keep the sections manageable - which for me means 15 minutes of audio / 5 pages of text. There is 1 'reading' per week. I hope that this gives you enough time to meditate on the text and engage with it in more than one way (audio/written, alone/together, meditate/study, etc).

REFLECT

The sidebar of each reading includes traditional prayers that reflect on the theme and suggestions for worship music and art pieces to ponder. Direct links to art and music are available at

As I worked on this study, I have enjoyed incorporating art as a part of my regular rhythm of worship. Song writers, painters, and poets often lead the way in inviting us to reflect on the word and work of God in active and embodied ways.

RESPOND

Each week concludes with an exercise that invites you to reflect on key learnings and consider what it looks like for you to respond in faith & faithfulness. This section will help you summarize your reading for the week and can be used to facilitate discussion. It is included, not because it is the only way to respond but as a reminder to respond intentionally to what you have read.

Remember that a response can include 'application' but is more than that. For example, I learned this year how to write a collect, which is a traditional prayer with a specific rhythm that reflects on a text of scripture (see appendix of this workbook). Prayer is one way to respond. Some other ideas include worship, repentance, and obedience.

GETTING STARTED

If you already have a regular habit of prayer and Bible reading, I encourage you to only adopt as much of this as serves you. If you do not have a regular habit of reading and prayer, I invite you to try out the ideas below and adapt them to work with your own everyday life. I suspect that if you try to do everything, it will be overwhelming (I will definitely not be using everything included every day). One of the goals here is to slow down and live with intention as we wait for Christmas, not to add one more thing to the 'to-do' list. A few examples of ways to participate include:

Audio Only:

- Listen to the audio recording at least twice
- ◆ Subscribe to the playlist for the week or build your own
- ◆ Discuss the reading with a friend

Text Only:

- ◆ Read and annotate the handout, read again in your own Bible
- ◆ Look at a piece of art or read the lyrics of one of the songs.
- ◆ Journal or complete the reflection exercise

- **4.** Listen to music
- **5.** Complete the reflection exercises

Family Friendly:

- ◆ Light a candle & memorize Rom 15:13

HEBREWS 11

What would it look like for you to respond this week?



If you choose to listen to the audio version of our daily readings, you will notice that each day ends with a prayer. This prayer is traditionally called a 'collect.' In all my reading, I still can't figure out where this name came from, but a collect seems to be like the haiku of prayers. Do you remember being taught to write a haiku in elementary school? It is such a simple form that anyone can do it - there is no pressure to be profound. And yet, I am often surprised by the beauty and freedom that comes from following such a simple pattern.

Many of us learned our patterns of prayer from listening to adults pray in church. But we often struggle with the line between petition and performance when praying aloud. Reading the psalms is our first indication that prayer does not need to pretty or pious; it is best when it is honest. So, I invite you to try writing a collect, not as art to perform but as a response to your reading and reflection.

A collect is often prayed in a worship gathering after people have read scripture and spent time in silence or aloud praying for individual concerns. The collect then wraps up the gathering and the time of worship. If you did a quick search, you could find collects for different everyday concerns and based on individual scriptures. There is no set length, rhythm, or rhyme to a collect, but there are a few common elements.

I was first led to see this pattern by Pádraig Ó Tuama in his book <u>"Daily Prayer with the Corymeela Community."</u> He points out these 5 common elements of a collect.

FLEMENTS

1 Address God

2 Rehearse part of the story of God

3 Name my desire - just one desire

4 Offer my reason for desiring this

5 Echo the name/story of God

Amen (or word of praise)

EXAMPLE

PAYING WITH THE CHURCH

I grew up convinced that pre-written prayers were boring and less genuine than spontaneous prayers. But as anyone sitting around a thanksgiving table waiting for an uncle to pray knows, sometimes spontaneity and length are not a good indicator of how meaningful a prayer is.

Interestingly, I held this opinion confidently while also having never really read many of the prayers offered by our brothers and sisters throughout history. When I did encounter them in college, I was humbled to realize that my own prayers, while genuine, were limited by my own lack of experience. It turned out that the things I 'spontaneously' prayed about were far more repetitive than any book of common prayer.

If you are new to praying a pre-written prayer, I invite you to start with praying the Lord's Prayer. Being bored with it is like being bored with the ocean - I suspect that our boredom is user error. In my experience, if I am bored, it is often because I don't know enough to be curious. So I am including here some extra resources that have been instrumental in my own journey of re-discovering and growing my capacity for curiosity and engagement with this prayer that Jesus taught his own disciples when they asked him to teach them how to pray.
