I. Sin spreads to the children. (vs 1-8)

- 1. Sin is infectious. (vs 1-2)
- 2. Sin is centered in the heart. (vs. 3-5) Genesis 6:5; Hebrews 11:4
- 3. Sin can harden hearts toward God. (vs. 6-8) James 1:5

II. Sin spreads to the generations. (vs 17-24)

- 1. Be fruitful and multiply. (vs 17-22)
- 2. The multiplication included sin's nature. (vs 23-24)

III. Sin's consequence – <u>death</u> – spread to the generations. (Ch 5:3-5)

- 1. Genealogies in the Bible are inspired by God. (vs 3-4)
- 2. Genealogies always have a beginning and an ending. (vs 5) Galatians 4:4-5
