1 Peter 5:1-5 // So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: <sup>2</sup> shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; <sup>3</sup> not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. <sup>4</sup> And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory. <sup>5</sup> Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

## A Gospel-Shaped Church 1 Peter 5:1-5

How does the gospel shape the relational life of the church?

- I. The calling of leaders
  - A. Willing, not forced (v. 2a)
  - B. Give, not get (v. 2b)
  - C. Out front, not top down (v. 3)
- II. The understanding of authority
  - A. From the perspective of the leader (v. 4)
  - B. From the perspective of the one being led (v. 4)
- III. The attitude toward others
  - A. The empowerment of humility (v. 1)
  - B. The expression of humility (v. 5)

## APPLICATION GUIDE

- 1. Which of the descriptions of shepherding in verses 2-3 are most difficult or challenging for you? How do these differ from a worldly definition of leadership?
- 2. As a shepherding leader, what is the evidence that you have stepped into functional savior mode and failed to acknowledge Christ as the chief Shepherd?
- 3. How have you been wounded by authority? How does this passage paint a healthy picture of authority as God has designed it?
- 4. In what ways are you prideful? What is the evidence of your pride? Practically, what does it look like for you to cloth yourself with humility towards others?
