SERMON LISTENING GUIDE // DATE:

Genesis 9:18-29 // ¹⁸ The sons of Noah who went forth from the ark were Shem, Ham, and Japheth. (Ham was the father of Canaan.) ¹⁹ These three were the sons of Noah, and from these the people of the whole earth were dispersed. ²⁰ Noah began to be a man of the soil, and he planted a vineyard. ²¹ He drank of the wine and became drunk and lay uncovered in his tent. ²² And Ham, the father of Canaan, saw the nakedness of his father and told his two brothers outside. ²³ Then Shem and Japheth took a garment, laid it on both their shoulders, and walked backward and covered the nakedness of their father. Their faces were turned backward, and they did not see their father's nakedness. ²⁴ When Noah awoke from his wine and knew what his youngest son had done to him, ²⁵ he said, "Cursed be Canaan; a servant of servants shall he be to his brothers." ²⁶ He also said, "Blessed be the Lord, the God of Shem; and let Canaan be his servant. ²⁷ May God enlarge Japheth, and let him dwell in the tents of Shem, and let Canaan be his servant." ²⁸ After the flood Noah lived 350 years. ²⁹ All the days of Noah were 950 years, and he died.

 - B. The greater Shem (v. 25-27; Heb. 12:2)

- 1. How does understanding that sin is birthed out of something good affect the way you handle and view your sin?
- 2. Why do you find joy and satisfaction in someone else's sin and failure?
- 3. In what ways do you medicate a primary sin issue with a secondary sin issue? In other words, how does sin feed on sin in your life?
- 4. Empowered by Jesus bearing your sin and shame, what opportunities do you have to cover the sin and shame of others? What does this look like?

What are they?
