Genesis 4:17-26 // ¹⁷ Cain knew his wife, and she conceived and bore Enoch. When he built a city, he called the name of the city after the name of his son, Enoch. ¹⁸ To Enoch was born Irad, and Irad fathered Mehujael, and Mehujael fathered Mehujael fathered Lamech. ¹⁹ And Lamech took two wives. The name of the one was Adah, and the name of the other Zillah. ²⁰ Adah bore Jabal; he was the father of those who dwell in tents and have livestock. ²¹ His brother's name was Jubal; he was the father of all those who play the lyre and pipe. ²² Zillah also bore Tubal-cain; he was the forger of all instruments of bronze and iron. The sister of Tubal-cain was Naamah. ²³ Lamech said to his wives: "Adah and Zillah, hear my voice; you wives of Lamech, listen to what I say: I have killed a man for wounding me, a young man for striking me. ²⁴ If Cain's revenge is sevenfold, then Lamech's is seventy-sevenfold." ²⁵ And Adam knew his wife again, and she bore a son and called his name Seth, for she said, "God has appointed for me another offspring instead of Abel, for Cain killed him."

MISSIONARY PRAYER // ALEX & IRINA PONOMAREV - MOST



Alex and Irina Ponomarev are from St. Petersburg, Russia, Alex and Irina were called to serve with Russian Language Ministries in Columbia, S.C., training American missionaries preparing to serve among Russian speakers and conducting local outreach to Slavic people in Columbia, S.C. In January of 2002, further developing their vision to reach Russian speakers in America and oversees, they initiated a new ministry – MOST. "Most" is the Russian word for "bridge" and this acronym stands for "Ministry of Outreach to Slavic Tribes." The Ponomarevs pray that the Lord will use them as human bridges of His love to Slavic peoples in Columbia, SC, and overseas, especially in Ukraine where they are aiding mission agencies and orphanages, foster homes, and elder-care homes, and in churches to effectively disciple Russian-speaking people.
