How do you forgive someone who repeatedly sins against you?

- I. The power to forgive

- 2. Do you struggle to accept that forgiveness recognizes no boundaries? Why? How does the difference between forgiveness and trust help you embrace the truth that forgiveness has no boundaries?
- 3. What relationship in your life is broken and in need of reconciliation? How have your attempts at reconciliation made things worse because you haven't forgiven that person?
