"In the berry patch, there's big berries and there's small berries; your bucket fills up faster if you find the big ones." – Br'er Rabbit.

Lord, it seems to me that the biggest, juiciest berries are always in the middle of the vine, You know - down where they are hard to spot and hard to reach. Claiming those big ones can cost you a thorn or two.

In Colossians we are reminded that whatever we do, we should do it heartily, as unto the Lord.
