Sermon Series: Are You Really Adventist?

Week 1: We Were Wrong

Key Scripture

• Revelation 10:10-11: The little scroll tasted sweet but turned sour, symbolizing the initial excitement and subsequent disappointment of the early Adventist movement.

Main Themes

1. Admitting Mistakes

- The Adventist movement began with a significant error in predicting Christ's return in 1844.
- Emphasizes the importance of honesty and humility in acknowledging past mistakes.

2. Inheritance and Responsibility

- We have inherited a legacy of disappointment but also a mission.
- o Our responsibility is to maintain, protect, and advance the mission of the church.

3. From Failure to Mission

- o Failure does not disqualify us; it can prepare us for greater mission work.
- The early Adventists, despite their initial error, continued to study and pray, leading to a deeper understanding of biblical truths.

4. Identity and Mission of Adventism

- o Seventh-day: Observance of the Sabbath as a declaration of God as Creator.
- o Adventist: Belief in the imminent return of Jesus Christ.
- Living by the rhythm of rest and moving with the urgency of hope.

5. Challenges and Corrections

- Past mistakes include using prophecy as a weapon, confusing unity with uniformity, and silencing diverse voices.
- The call to love people into discipleship rather than scaring them into baptism.

6. Call to Action

- Encourages believers to be active participants in the mission, not just spectators.
- Emphasizes the need for courage, honesty, and a commitment to Jesus above all else.
