WHAT IS INSECURITY?

A psychological state characterized by a lack of confidence, uncertainty about oneself, and a deep sense of vulnerability or inadequacy. It often involves chronic self-doubt, fear of rejection or failure, and a strong need for external validation.

SELF-WORTH

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
PSYCHOLOGICAL ROOTS




SOCIAL COMPARISON AND MEDIA


- Constant comparison creates insecurity
- Social media intensifies unrealistic standards



FACEBOOK: 2004

...from the very beginning, Facebook was designed to exploit "a vulnerability in human psychology." He added that the founders (including Mark Zuckerberg) "understood this consciously, and we did it anyway," using a deliberate social-validation feedback loop—dopamine hits from likes and comments—to hook users and keep them engaged.





SPIRITUAL INSECURITY?

A state of inner instability, fear, or inadequacy that arises when a person's sense of identity, worth, or purpose is not firmly rooted in God. It often reflects a reliance on self (feelings), others, or worldly standards for validation, rather than trusting in the unchanging truth of God's love and acceptance.

SINS ORIGINS OF MISTRUST

INSECURITY AS MISPLACED IDENTITY

- Galatians 1:10:Whose approval are you seeking?
- - Romans 8:38-39: Nothing can separate you from God's love

BEHAVIORS OF INSECURITY

- People-pleasing and avoidance
- Perfectionism or arrogance
- Sensitivity to criticism
- Control and passive-aggression

EMOTIONAL & RELATIONAL IMPACT

- Linked to anxiety and depression
- - Damaged relationships and poor self-esteem

HEALING THROUGH AWARENESS

- - Identify false beliefs
- - Use CBT strategies to reframe thinking
- - Practice self-compassion

RESTING IN GOD'S TRUTH

- - John 1:12:You are God's child
- - Isaiah 43:1: "You are mine."

FORMING SECURE RELATIONSHIPS

- Therapy and mentorship
- Healthy faith communities
- - Building trust over time
