



Oneness

Broken Belonging

The experience of a deep sense of hurt, abandonment, or pain resulting from the loss of a place or community where one felt truly connected. It describes a state where an individual's sense of acceptance and identity within relationships has been severed, leading to feelings of isolation, grief, or disconnection from oneself and others. This brokenness disrupts access to safety, authenticity, and love.

Otherness: The Fear of Man

Defining and identifying people or groups as fundamentally different from me, which often leads to social exclusion and marginalization. This differentiation introduces competition as groups or individuals compare themselves to Others to assert superiority or maintain status. It breeds animosity because it emphasizes differences and creates hierarchies.



Insecurity What happened, Adam?

Insecurity emerges when one forgets, rejects, or questions what God says about them or Himself. Without God, we must find alternate, arbitrary, and substitute ways to sustain our belief that we should exist.



Humility



All of us, like sheep, have strayed away. We have left God's paths to follow our own. Yet the Lord laid on him (Jesus) the sins of us all.

Loneliness



Loneliness "can increase the risk for premature death as much as smoking up to 15 cigarettes a day." Loneliness and lack of social connection are associated with higher risks of heart disease, stroke, anxiety, depression and dementia.




