Warm Up: How would you prepare your home for the visit of a very important person?

- 1. Read about John's birth as recorded in Luke 1:5-25, 57-80. What stands out to you?
- 2. Share some of your initial thoughts and impressions from the sermon. What is unique about the gospel of Mark?
- 3. What is the implication of a human (Jesus Christ) being the Son of God (v.1)? (See also John 14:6 & Acts 4:12).
- 4. In verses 2-3, John quotes from Isaiah and Malachi. What was John the Baptist's main task?
- 5. According to v. 4-5 describe the message John was preaching and the response of the people. Why the wilderness? What is repentance? Why confession? Why baptism? What does it mean to be forgiven by God?
- 6. Read v. 6-7. Discuss what John the Baptist was like. What can we learn from him?
- 7. After our own wilderness, repentance and forgiveness God offers us the ability to be filled with the Holy Spirit (v.8). How can this make a difference in our lives?
