## **Table Talk**

- Why do people sin? Is it nurture or nature? Are people born sinners? What does Jesus teach in this passage?
- The Bible tells us that through faith in Jesus and the receiving of his life, we receive a new heart. Why do we need a new heart? How is a new heart better than just being forgiven?
  - (A clarifying thought: Ceremonially unclean hands or foods do not affect your heart. It's not what you put in your body, but what comes out of your heart that matters to God. And Jesus lists the many evils that "come from inside and make a man unclean.")
- As it was with the Pharisees, are you focused more on your body than on your heart? Which do you care for more diligently?
- Parents: Help your children to understand that they need Jesus to give them a new heart. Sometimes when we talk to children about salvation we use the language of "asking Jesus into your heart." But this can fail to show the truth that Jesus gives us a brand new heart. Instead we might say "do you want Jesus to give you a new heart."
