#3- A "	misunderstood messiah" takes one to a place in their faith (31-33)
•	Jesus is the promised Messiah, the Christ, the One who traveled to Jerusalem to suffer, die and
	rise in 3 days to defeat sin, Satan and death.
1.	n Action: Remember the reason this account is in the middle of Mark is because IT'S THE HINGE THAT EVERYTHING ELSE SWINGS ON. Make sure you just don't like Jesus but that you live and worship Him as the Messiah and your

Table Talk

Warm Up: What makes you, you? What are the things about you that other people would say are your best qualities?

Read Mark 8:22-37

Question: Why is the blind man only partially healed initially? Is there any kind of relationship between the healing of the blind man and the revelation that Peter has in this chapter?

(HINT: When the blind man was partially healed, he could see something, but he did not see clearly. Then Peter proves that he has partial knowledge of who Jesus really is, but immediately afterwards shows that his understanding is partial. He knows Jesus is the Christ. But he cannot fathom a Christ who would suffer many things and be killed (even if he were to rise again 3 days later). He perceives something, but he does not see clearly.)

Question: How does this passage describe what kind of Messiah Jesus would be?

Question: What evidence do we have in this passage that the disciples do not see clearly what kind of a Messiah Jesus is?

Question: If someone asked you Who is Jesus how would you answer? Take a few moments to write out your answer?

Closing Prayer: Jesus, you healed people to prove your identity. Help me to understand and live my life believing you are the Promised One, the Messiah and my Savior from sin. Amen.
