## The Mystery & Tension of a Sovereign God (Part 2)

**Text: Romans 9:14-29** 

Introduction:
<b>BIG IDEA:</b> God's truth is meant to guide us through the mystery and tension to a place of <u>rest in Him</u> .
Review 1 <sup>st</sup> Question: If many Jews did not love Jesus, did God's Word <u>FAIL</u> ? (6-13)
<ul> <li>God's Word has not and will never fail.         <ul> <li>Paul explains that not every Jew born in racial Israel was a member of the true Israel.</li> <li>From the beginning, being a true Jew was a matter of the heart and not something of the flesh.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Abraham's two sons         <ul> <li>Ishmael</li> <li>Issac</li> </ul> </li> <li>Issacs's two sons         <ul> <li>Jacob a pretty rough past but embraced God's promises.</li> <li>Esau traded his stake in God's promise for a bowl of soup.</li> <li>Esau represents those Jews who inwardly trade obedience to God's promise for indulging the lusts of their flesh.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Why is it some of Abraham's descendants love God (are true Israel), and others do not. Paul's answer in Roman 9:11-13 is not hard to miss, it's just difficult truth to accept.</li> </ul>
2 <sup>nd</sup> Question: Is God unjust in how He dispenses? (14-18)
<ul> <li>The hardening of Pharaoh's heart is mentionedx in Exodus.</li> <li>Exodus 7:3, 13, 14, 22; 8:15, 19, 32; 9:7, 12, 34-35; 10:1, 20, 27; 11:10; 13:15; 14:4, 8, 17</li> <li>Some verses say God hardened Pharaoh's heart, while others say Pharaoh hardened his own heart.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Understanding how God "hardened Pharaoh's heart is the key:</li> <li>Exodus 34:6–7, God tells us who He is.</li> <li>God hardened Pharaoh's heart with patience, grace, love, and mercy.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>God is not only faithful in His grace, but He is also faithful in His justice.</li> <li>The responsibility for Pharoah's hard heart lies with himself because he repeatedly rejected God's offer of grace.</li> </ul>
3 <sup>rd</sup> Question: Is God unjust is holding us? (19-29)  Answer #1 - God has the to do as He wills (20-21)

Answer #2 - God delays his punishment to some in order to show his mercy to others (22-23)

Answer #3 - God \_\_\_\_\_ to show mercy to both Jews and Gentiles (24-29)

## **Truth into Action**

- Since God can change hearts, **check your heart toward God right now.** [Is there any part of your heart that is hardening toward God?]
- Instead of complaining God is unjust for not saving everyone, rest in the precious reality that God is gracious and merciful to save anyone.

Warm Up: Discuss what the difference is between JUSTICE and MERCY?

- 1. Who can you think of, in addition to Paul, who was not seeking God when God found them?
- 2. If you had to pick one word to define your heart when God found you, what would that be and why (hard, broken, fearful, hopeful, selfish, tender)?
- 3. Look up the places where the Bible uses the analogy of the potter and the clay that Paul uses (Isaiah 29:16; 45:9–11; Jeremiah 18:1–6).
- 4. How is your heart toward God now? Is there any part of your heart that is hardening toward God?
- 5. How would you use Romans 9 to answer someone who says God is unjust?
