Table Talk

WARM UP: What kind of people do you find it easiest to listen to?

v. 12 – Paul defends himself in this letter. Why? What does Paul say about his conscience?

- Do you think this is a true statement? We too will be able to appeal to a clear conscience only so far as we are characterized by a posture bowed before the Lord God and a pattern of life lived according to God's way. Discuss the implications of your answer:

v. 14 – Paul says of the Corinthians “on the day of our Lord Jesus you will boast of us as we will boast of you”. Paul uses the return of Jesus as a filter. Do you agree or disagree that there is great value in thinking today about Jesus' return? If so, why? If not, why?

v. 19-22 - Summarize in a sentence or two, what God has done for the Corinthians (and Christians today).

- How do these truths make our lives different from those around us?

v. 1:23 -2:4 – Some Christians imagine that the apostle Paul was driven and task-oriented, steamrolling over people's needs and feelings to “reach the world” with the gospel. Work through the following questions to get some clarity on Paul's heart.

- v. 23-24 Based upon the sermon, what is this joy?
- Discuss this quotation from John Piper: “If all you have is a decision for Christ and no delight in Christ, you don't have Christ.”
- Read back through this passage and record what you view of Paul's heart:

(Reflection) Paul's conscience was clear. He was not aware of any specific instance in which he had acted inappropriately toward the Corinthians. Can you make a similar claim regarding the people in your life (family members, friends, neighbors, coworkers)? Is there anyone from whom you need to seek forgiveness today?
