## **Jesus Despised the Shame?**



Introduction:

Big Idea: Jesus' suffering was engulfed in \_\_\_\_\_\_, but He despised it as He focused upon your <u>rescue</u>. #1-Jesus was mocked but HE \_\_\_\_\_ that shame for you (15:15-20)


- The soldiers \_\_\_\_\_ Jesus (15)

  - Those passing by derided (hurling abuse) and wagging their heads (a gesture of hatred and scorn)
  - The priests & scribes mocked (sneering, a lifting up of the nose in distain Luke 23:35, Matthew 27:41)
  - The thieves reviled (insulted)

#2-Jesus took ALL THE \_\_\_\_\_ so you would not have to (Hebrews 12:2)

 Hebrews 12:2 looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, DESPISING THE SHAME, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

- Ponder these questions:
  - Oculd I mock Jesus today?
  - O Am I mocking Jesus right now in my life?
- Marvel at the mindset of Jesus. He despised the shame, so His disciples could be fully and completely accepted.

## **Table Talk**

**Warm Up:** What was your most memorable embarrassing moment? How does being embarrassed differ from being shamed?

- 1. Why do you think the soldiers treated Jesus this way?
- 2. What does Jesus' silence in the face of mockery teach us about his character?
- 3. How can we apply Jesus' example to our own lives when we face injustice or mistreatment?
- 4. What does this passage reveal about the true nature of Jesus' kingship?
- 5. Jesus was (1) psychologically ridiculed, (2) physically beaten, (3) spiritually abandoned by God, and (4) mortally executed. How do these torments compare?
- 6. What is the value in contemplating the appalling enormity of Jesus' suffering? Did the movie *The Passion of the Christ* (2004) go too far in its depiction of His physical suffering? Explain.

**Prayer**: Lord Jesus you experienced shame beyond and you despised for my sake. Help me to live my life fully aware of the acceptance I have in Christ. Amen!
