Table Talk

Warm Up: How have you seen God move (work) in someone's life recently?

- 1. How did Paul answer the question in v. 1, "Has God rejected his people?"
- 2. God is faithful to fulfill His promises to us. How does this truth encourage you?
- 3. What evidence does he offer in support of this conclusion in verses 2-4?
 - a. Did Elijah know of this 7000 person remnant?
 - b. What was the spiritual climate of that day?
 - c. If during Israel's darkest spiritual time 7000 remained faithful, what does this tell us is likely about other times in their history?
- 4. God is still saving people from among the Jews. The number is still very small, but He is still working among them. Do you know anyone who is from a Jewish background? If so, have you taken the time to share the gospel with them in an honest and sensitive way? If you have a Jewish friend, begin to pray for them regularly. Pray for their openness to the gospel. After praying for them, look for an appropriate time where you can have a good talk with them about the claims of Christ.
- 5. As Gentiles, we are presently enjoying a special time of blessing during God's program for mankind. What things can you do to make the most of this time? What sorts of things should we be doing to take advantage of this special time that God has given us in His program?
- 6. God is all-wise and we will never be able to understand the depths of that wisdom. Yet, God wants us to grow in wisdom. Study the following passages and write a brief statement on what each teaches about our need to grow in wisdom.
 - a. Proverbs 1:20-23
 - b. Proverbs 2:1-8
 - c. Proverbs 3:13-18
 - d. How do you think a Christian can grow in wisdom?
- 7. God deserves all the glory for the things He has done and is doing in and through our lives. We should not be receiving any of the glory or praise. Is there any area of your life or area of ministry in which you are taking the glory instead of God? How can you direct the glory to God in this area of your life?
