Text: Romans 1:24-32

Introduction:

Big Idea: ______ that both honors God and expresses thankfulness to God will keep one's life on track but distorted worship always derails a life.

1. God pours out his wrath upon those who suppress rather than celebrate his truth (1:18-21)

- His ______ is ongoing and ever present (18)
- The knowledge of God's attributes in creation leave man with no excuse (19-20)
- Humans must decide how to respond to general revelation (21)

2. God's wrath (passive wrath) ______ unbelief to run its course (23-28)

- God's wrath = God's justice
- God's wrath comes in two forms:
 - wrath—In Romans 1:18, Paul says, "For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who by their unrighteousness suppress the truth."
 - _____wrath—In Romans 2:5, Paul says, "You are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed."
- God doesn't force our worship or acknowledgement of him yet
- God's wrath allows for us to make bad deals
 - **Bad Deal #1** they *exchanged* the glory of God for images (vs. 23) ... so God *exchanged* them over to disgraceful passions and unnatural sexual desires (vs. 26)
 - o Bad Deal #2 They dishonored God (vs. 21) ... so God let them dishonor themselves (vs. 24)
 - Bad Deal #3: they did not see fit to acknowledge God (vs. 28) ... so God gave them up to an unfit mind" (vs. 28)

3. When God gives us what we want it reveals the total spiritual brokenness of all mankind (23-31)

- Sin has caused a disordered world
 - o (vs. 23-28) That's _____ disorder
 - (vs. 29-30) They were filled with all manner of unrighteousness, evil, covetousness (greed), malice (wickedness). That's _____ disorder
 - They are full of envy, murder, strife (quarrels), deceit, maliciousness. They are gossips, slanderers, That's ______disorder
 - haters of God, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, That's ______disorder
- disobedient to parents, foolish, faithless, heartless, ruthless. That's ______ disorder
 It's what theologians call "the doctrine of ______." It doesn't mean we are all as bad as we could be, but rejection of God at the center corrupted every part of our lives.

- Believe that Jesus came to fix your thinking and your behavior so that you might worship him alone.
