Table Talk

Warm Up: Ecclesiastes clues us to the reality that God himself put FOREVER in the human heart. James reminds us that our earthly journey is a lot like a mist that lingers until the wind blows it away. Do you think about FOREVER often? Discuss this with those around your table.

- v. 16 What makes keeping going so hard on the one hand and so important on the other?
- v.17 What is God doing in us and in our world? Why is that a motivating factor to keep pressing on?

v. 18 - The Greek verb translated "look . . . at" in 2 Corinthians 4:18 carries the concept of fixing one's gaze intently or concentrating on something. As a Christian, Paul did not value material, temporal things visible to physical eyes. Rather, he valued spiritual, eternal things. Jesus changed Paul's perspective and enabled him to see what really mattered in life. Where is your gaze lately? What has discouraged you? Temporary earthly distractions put a chokehold on spiritual productivity. If you have found this to be true in your life, it's time to refocus on your personal spiritual motivation.

Closing Prayer: Eternal God, one day with you is like a thousand years, help me to grow a FOREVER perspective so that we might NOT LOSE HEART in the face of hard things. For your glory and our good—amen!
