- 1. Why does Paul say in verse 7, "look at what is before your eyes?" What does he want them to see?
- 2. What sins either cause comparing or spring out of comparing with others?
  - [Help: Jealousy, pride, boasting, selfishness, empty conceit, vain rivalry, and greed are just a few of the sins that comparing either stems from or leads to.]
- 3. Hebrews 12:2 tells us to "fix our eyes on Jesus." Set your eyes on Him means to focus on Jesus and to carefully examine Jesus. Remember that His is the only opinion that really matters. How can you fix your eyes on Jesus the Author and Finisher of your faith?
- 4. What did Paul remind the Corinthians of in verse 14?
- 5. What can we learn about Paul's goal in verse 15?
- 6. Jeremiah 9:24 reads "but let him who boasts boast in this, that he understands and knows me, that I am the LORD who practices steadfast love, justice, and righteousness in the earth. For in these things I delight, declares the LORD." What does God mean to communicate to you in this portion of the Bible?
- 7. Boasting means to lift up or draw attention to something. Normally it is used in a negative connotation when referring to oneself. Boasting in the Lord is drawing attention to Him and lifting Him up. It is magnifying Him as the object of praise. Instead of saying, "I am great" it is saying, "God is great." What can you do today to "boast in the Lord?"
