 - ➤ this is not random act of <u>nature</u>, but an intentional act of a sovereign <u>King</u>.




When we <u>run</u>, God pursues.




How might God be pursuing you with a storm this morning?






On the surface, Jonah's declaration in verse 9 seems faithful but it's dripping with pathetic irony.











Though far from God, the pagan sailors are drawn <u>close</u> through the fear of the Lord.
