FUNDAMENTAL LAW

- ► Apologetic Context
- Law of Non-contradiction

"The most fundamental law of all thought is the Law of Non-Contradiction. It states that something cannot be both true and false at the same time and in the same sense."

12 Steps, Geisler, p11

NECESSARY CONFIRMATION

Sole law of logic requiring confirmation for apologetics
 Various Laws of Logic still utilized
 "Horns of the dilemma"

MAGTF EXAMPLE



REAL WORLD EXAMPLES

- Apple and not an apple
 \$100 bill & a penny
- Non-ethanol gasoline & vegetable oil
- ► Sushi & fried bologna

EFFECTIVE EXAMPLE

- Arabic Philosopher, Avicenna
- Those who deny the first principle [Law of Non-Contradiction] should be flogged or burned until they admit that it is not the same/ thing to be burned and not burned, or whipped and not whipped.
 - 12 Steps, Geisler, p12

LAW OF NC MAXIMIZATION

IOT maximize Law of Non-Contradiction
Opposites (Merriam Webster Online):
2a: occupying an opposing and often antagonistic position
2b: diametrically different (as in nature or character)
3: contrary to one another or to a thing specified

OPPOSITES

- ► For some opposites, one must be true
 - Day / Night
 - ► Theism / Atheism
 - Believer / Non-believer
 - "He who is not with Me is against Me, and he who does not gather with Me scatters abroad" (Matthew 12:30 NKJV)

APOLOGETICAL DIFFICULTY

- Religions seem to be more about divergent opinions than direct opposites
- ► Challenge is discerning:
 - ► True system with some errors
 - Erroneous systems with some truths



APOLOGETIC DISCERNMENT

Key lies in an assessment of the core doctrines ► For Christianity, the Essential Doctrines are the metric ► God is one or God is many Humans need salvation or they do not Salvation comes through God's gift or man's work ► Jesus is fully God and fully man or either man or God

APOLOGETIC DISCERNMENT

► For Christianity, the Essential Doctrines are the metric

- Grace is funneled via faith or works
- Christ's death on the cross fully saves believing humanity from death or it does not
- Christ rose from the dead or He did not



ENGAGEMENT GOAL

Victory achieved at this stage:
We might all be false, but we <u>cannot</u> all be true
Time to launch into Theistic Apologetics:
One foot planted on tenets of Truth
One foot planted on Law of Non-Contradiction

ENDING EXHORTATION

- ►There is no neutrality when it comes to Jesus the Christ
- "He who is not with Me is against Me, and he who does not gather with Me scatters abroad" (Matthew 12:30)
- "Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14.6)
- So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth" (Revelation 3:16)
