

In Pursuit of Fruitfulness

Psa 1:1-3 Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. (2) But his delight is in the law of the LORD; and in his law doth he meditate day and night. (3) And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth sháll prosper.



In Pursuit of Fruitfulness

<u>Blessed</u>- אֶשֶׁר ('esher) eh'-sher-Masculine plural construction as an interjection meaning "How Happy!"

Walk not with Ungodly- That is not following or going along with the immoral.

Stand in the way of Sinners- Abide, confirm, or continue with the guilty.

Sit in the seat of the scornful- Sit in judgement with those that mock or are scoffers.

What happens at salvation?

that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper.

Fruit in season... What might affect those seasons?

- Age and experience (wisdom)
- Life Circumstances
- Our Surroundings
- The available of water, or how closely we are planted to the water.

You will bring forth fruit!!!





In Pursuit of Fruitfulness

Joh 15:4-5 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. (5) I am the vine, ye *are* the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.

Joh 15:8 Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.

Again... You will bear fruit!!!

1) fruit


- 1a) fruit, produce (of the ground)
- 1b) fruit, offspring, children, progeny (of the womb)
- 1c) fruit (of actions) (figuratively)

Καρπός karpos **Part of Speech:** noun masculine

- 1) fruit
- 1a) the fruit of the trees, vines, of the fields
- 1b) the fruit of one's loins, i.e. his progeny, his posterity
- 2) that which originates or comes from something, an effect, result
 - 2a) work, act, deed
 - 2b) advantage, profit, utility
 - 2c) praises, which are presented to God as a thank offering
 - 2d) to gather fruit (i.e. a reaped harvest) into life eternal (as into a granary), is used in fig. discourse of those who by their labours have fitted souls to obtain eternal life.

Fruits of the Spirit

Gal 5:22-23 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, (23) Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.

Love- Agape love, brotherly love, affection, good will, or a feast of love.

Joy- Gladness, more importantly what your joy is found in. Justification, pardon, peace, adoption, and eternal glory. In infirmities like Paul and in trials like in James.

Fruits of the Spirit

<u>Peace</u>- State of tranquility, could be between states or persons. But most importantly between God. Peace that passes understanding. Or like Christ said "Blessed are the Peacemakers." or those that desire tranquility.

Longsuffering- Patient endurance of wrongs or the avenging of wrongs. As James says Trials work patience (Joyful endurance).

<u>Gentleness</u>- Moral goodness as it relates to kindness or even integrity of kindness. It represents the act of goodness directed towards others..

Goodness- Linked with gentleness or kindness is the act of doing good upon others.





Fruits of the Spirit

Faith- Conviction of truth, belief in particular in man's relationship to God.

Meekness- Humility and lowliness of mind. Walking humbly understanding wherein our every blessing flows.

Temperance- That is self control.

- Bearing in mind that it is fruit (singular) not fruit (plural).
- Also in season.
- Also with differing levels of constituent components.
