



Fisher Clark is a native of McMinnville, Oregon and entered active duty in 2008 after 13 years of civilian pastoral ministry in The United Methodist Church. She graduated from Dakota Wesleyan University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Communications and Religion-Philosophy. She holds a Master of Divinity degree from Emory University, and a Doctor of Ministry degree in Soul Care from Wesley Theological Seminary. She completed her Joint Professional Military Education Phase I through the Naval War College, and is a Board Certified Clinical Chaplain through the National Association of Veterans Affairs Chaplains following her completion of four Clinical Pastoral Education units at Naval Medical Center San Diego.

At Sea, she served as the Command Religious Ministries Head of Department Chaplain, and Carrier Strike Group-12 Chaplain for her milestone tour, aboard USS Gerald R. Ford (CVN 78) for their maiden deployment. She has also served as Command Religious Ministries Department's Principal Assistant aboard USS George H.W. Bush (CVN 77), as Chaplain Afloat on USNS MERCY (T-AH 19) during the COVID-19 pandemic, and At-Sea Command Chaplain USS Anchorage (LPD-23) during the ship's maiden deployment to 5th and 7th fleets.

She is currently ashore serving as the United States Fleet Forces Maritime Operations Center Chaplain. Gen and her husband, John, have been attending our church since last fall. We are honored to have her and John as a part of our church family.



DID YOU KNOW? Did you know that LUMC has its own Columbarium in the Courtyard Memorial Garden? Here are some pertinent facts:

- The Columbarium is intended to provide opportunities for church members and their immediate families to make end-of-life plans and to remember their loved ones in the Christian tradition, near their church home.
- The Columbarium has 60 niches, each with the capacity to hold two urns. To date, 15 niches have been purchased.
- You may select the niche that you want on a first-served basis, as determined by the date of receipt of a fully completed, paid-in-full Agreement between the niche purchaser and the church.
- Each niche costs \$2,000, which includes engraving of the niche stone faceplate and perpetual maintenance.
- Purchase of a niche eliminates the need to choose a burial site, casket, vault and monument. Also, there is no need to plan for interment and memorial services at different times and locations.
