- 2. The Spies Findings
 - a. Problem: <u>FEAR</u> of the <u>UNKNOWN</u>
 - b. Problem: 10 OF12 said WE CAN'T (meaning we WON'T)
 - c. Solution: GOD'S PLAN will be FULFILLED
- 3. Israel wandered due to **DISOBEDIENCE** and **UNBELIEF**.
- 4. The Cost to that Generation
 - Lost joy of <u>CANAAN</u>
 - b. Effected <u>FAMILIES</u>

- c. Lost $\underline{PRIVLEGE}$ to be a part of \underline{WHAT} God is \underline{DOING} .
- d. FORTY YEARS for an ELEVEN DAY journey.
